The centre has a young profile due to the *Baltic and Eastern European Graduate School* (BEEGS), where more than 70 doctoral students have completed a PhD since 2001, though it also includes senior researchers and second-cycle (Master's) students. Our research is multidisciplinary, and broad contextualisation of research issues in time and space allows us to strive for deepened understanding of the ecological, political, social, historic and cultural situation in the region. Examples of areas in which research is conducted are regionalism and changing borders in the new Europe, geopolitical constructions, the use of history in Europe after 1989/1991 and the dynamics between sustainability, social change, knowledge and technology in the Baltic Sea region. The working language at CBEES is English.

- conduct relevant external monitoring.

- Doctoral degree and the status of associate professor (Swedish *docent*) or equivalent
- Documented experience of research leadership, good collaborative and administrative skills
- Documented experience of research within a relevant area
- Good skills in Swedish and English
- Good knowledge of the research conducted at Södertörn University
- The ability to develop, coordinate and highlight research in CBEES' profile area.
